Their examination does not relate to any additional schedules as required by the *Act*. The audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. As well, the audit assesses the accounting principles used, the significant estimates made by management, and reviews and evaluates the Village's system of internal control and procedures to provide reasonable assurance that the overall financial statements are presented fairly. The auditors present the results to Council once a year.
