### 1. ORDER:

Mayor Reinhardt brought the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

#### 2. ADDITIONS TO AGENDA:

Resolved, that we add the CFO Karen Sharp memo regarding the street lighting kiosk repair, and the subject of splash park funding, to the agenda.

### 3. MINUTES:

Resolved, that we approve the Council meeting minutes from August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020, as circulated. (Moved by Councillor Gray)

## 4. UNFINISHED BUSINESS / BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES:

Resolved, that we proceed with the purchase of 1000 Village information rack cards for the quoted price of \$425.

Resolved, that we move forward with Short Term Rental Policy (Draft #2 September 2020), for a stakeholder consultation phase, and that we amend the policy with the statement that 'we reserve the right to reconsider a system of limiting the number of STR permits, at a future date'. Administrative memo to Council

Development Variance Permit 38

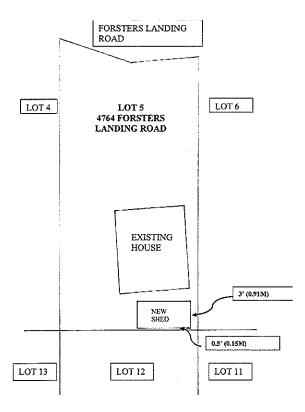

The variance being applied for is the reduction of a side yard and rear setback to permit the location of a shed/shop that is currently being constructed.

The property is located at 4764 Forsters Landing Road.

Setback variances requested are:

- Reduction of rear setback from 1.5m to 0.15m (6 in)
- Reduction of east side setback from 1.5m to 0.91m (3 ft)



Shed/shop size is  $23' \times 12'$  in dimension and has a wall facing Lot 12 being 9' tall. The roof slopes to the north so drainage from the shed/shop will not flow onto the neighbours property.

As required by Section 499 of the Local Government Act, notices of this variance request were sent to all neighbours within 50 m of the property for review and comment.

### **DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 38, 2020**

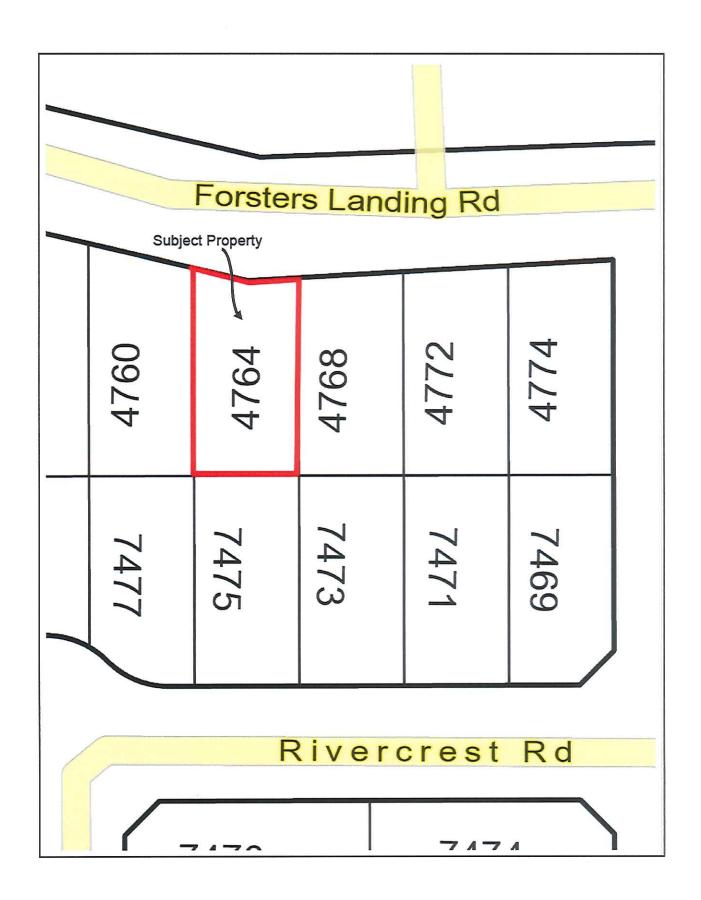
(hereinafter referred to as the "Permittee")

- 1) This Development Variance Permit is issued subject to compliance with all of the Bylaws of, and in effect in, the Village of Radium Hot Springs, applicable thereto, except as specifically varied or supplemented by this Permit.
- 2) This Development Variance Permit applies only to those lands within the Village described below and shown on Schedule A:
  - a) Civic: 4764 Forsters Landing Road.
  - b) Legal: Lot 5, Plan NEP13620, District Lot 3947, Kootenay Land District.
- 3) Pursuant to the applicable sections of the Local Government Act and Community Charter, this permit varies the following requirements of the Village of Radium Hot Springs Zoning Bylaw No 338, 2007 and subsequent amendments:

For location of a 7m (23') x 3.65m (12') shed

- i) Decrease the required rear setback from 1.5 m to 0.15m (6")
- ii) Decrease the required east side setback from 1.5m to 0.91m (3').
- 4) This permit is not subject to an expiry date.
- 5) This permit shall come into force and effect on the date of an authorizing resolution by the Council of the Village of Radium Hot Springs.
- 6) This permit shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.
