WHEREAS providing no-cost prescription contraception has been shown to improve health outcomes for parents and infants by reducing the risks associated with unintended pregnancy, and is likely to reduce direct medical costs on the provincial health system;

WHEREAS contraceptive methods targeted at men (such as condoms or vasectomies) are available at low cost or are covered by BC's Medical Services Plan, whereas contraceptive methods for people with uteruses (such as birth control pills, intra-uterine devices, or hormone injections) have high up-front costs, making access to contraception unequal and gendered;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

THAT Council directs the Mayor to write to the Provincial Government to urge them make all prescription contraception in BC available at no cost under the Medical Services Plan.

WHEREAS many rural areas in the Province are isolated with limited communications and large distances from established communities, there is a need in extenuating circumstances for Emergency Medical Aid First Responders (EMAFR) to attend emergency scenes at a considerable distance from the station. These 'Out of Jurisdiction' responses require both skilled personnel and a rescue vehicle and can be of several hours duration. In many instances, the EMAFR are located closer to the scene of an incident than BC Ambulance Service (BCAS) and can provide a response sooner than the BCAS;

AND WHEREAS during these 'Out of Jurisdiction 'responses, Fire Departments are re-imbursed for activities under Emergency Management BC Policy 2.07, Road and Medical Rescue; while Emergency Medical Aid First Responders are not re-imbursed for their activities at the same scene;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Emergency Management BC be requested to amend Road and Medical Rescue Policy 2.07 to include Emergency Medical Aid First Responders as eligible for re-imbursement under Section 2.07.3 for extenuating circumstances.

f) Council resolved to bring forward the following resolution to UBCM regarding library funding:

Whereas libraries in British Columbia are largely financed by levies paid by local governments, and where provincial library funding has remained stagnant for the past 10 years;

And whereas public libraries are central to communities, providing equitable access to vital resources, including internet, computers, digital library tools, and inperson services from expert staff;

And whereas public libraries provide British Columbians with low-barrier services, that support job seekers and small businesses, that increase literacy in communities, that advance reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, and that promote equity and inclusion;

Therefore be it resolved that The Village of Radium Hot Springs and Radium Library Board urges the Government of British Columbia to provide clarity on the funding formula and equity in funding for public libraries in BC;

And be it further resolved that the Province ensure that BC Libraries will henceforth receive regular increases to Provincial Government funding reflecting the BC Consumer Price Index in subsequent years.

10. SUNDRY MATTERS & QUESTIONS:

Councillor Gray commented on the current housing needs and the impact of STR's on housing in the Village. Councillor Gray suggested a committee be formed with staff, however CAO Dohlen advised that staff time was limited right now. Mayor Reinhardt advised that the housing needs report will be tabled in mid March and following that Council needs to work with local economic development staff with the possibility of hiring a consultant.

Councillor Gray gave a shout out to all local Olympians, including his niece Cassidy Gray. Councillor Logan asked for a sheep update. Kent Kebe advised that hill monitoring was going well and that they are seeing approximately 80-105 at the feeding station. No incidents in two weeks. Kent is also on a weekly call with MOTI.

CFO Sharp advised donations were coming in daily. Mayor Reinhardt advised that Minister Fleming was meeting with an environmental group and the potential for funding for the overpass project would be discussed. Tourism Radium is also creating educational postings via social media in order to keep up the interest in donating for the proposed overpass.

Kent also provided an STR update, advising that approximately 52 licences have been issued or are in the process of being issued. As a result of applications, 24 hour call contractors and cleaning businesses looking after STR's are now being identified and are applying for business licences. CFO Sharp advised that RMI will continue for another year and that a new resort strategy will be required. Karen also advised that a village staff member is also looking for housing. CAO Dohlen advised that the CBT community meeting date is being decided upon. CVP reporter Hayley Grinder asked for clarification on the proposed new speed limit on Forsters and the resolution to have first responders paid for calls outside of Radium's jurisdiction.

BYLAW NO. 473, 2022.

Being a bylaw to regulate traffic speed limits within the Village of Radium Hot Springs.

WHEREAS pursuant to the relevant sections of the Motor Vehicle Act and the Community Charter, the Council is empowered to regulate traffic within the Village of Radium Hot Springs;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Village of Radium Hot Springs, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

- (1) On any street within the Village of Radium Hot Springs:
 - (a) no person shall drive a vehicle at a greater rate of speed than forty (40) kilometers per hour, unless otherwise posted, and;
 - (b) where speed limits are posted at playgrounds and parks, the posted rate of speed shall be thirty (30) kilometers per hour.
- (2) This bylaw shall not apply to speed limit controls on the Provincial Highways.
- (3) On any alley or lane within the Village of Radium Hot Springs no person shall drive any vehicle at a rate of speed in excess of twenty (20) kilometers per hour.
- (4) The Public Works Superintendent, at his discretion or upon resolution of Council, is hereby authorized to locate, establish and maintain upon any streets such signs, traffic control devices or barriers as may be deemed necessary for the regulation, direction and control of traffic.
- (5) This Bylaw may be enforced by any member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and penalties will be those as prescribed by Provincial legislation and regulation.
- (6) This bylaw may be referred to as the 'Speed Limit Bylaw No. 473, 2022'.

To whom it may concern on the Radium Hot Springs Village Council,

We are writing this letter to request the re-consideration of Bylaw 244 Section 3.13, which states that "no person shall carry on business as a mobile store or restaurant in any location within the Village of Radium Hot Springs, including on a highway, sidewalk or boulevard, or on private property". 'We' are Peter Penkala and Savannah Taylor - the owner-operators of 'The Good Badger Cafe', a mobile high quality coffee vending business, which will be operating in the columbia valley starting in the spring of 2022.

It is our perspective that while the bylaw does have merit in ensuring that existing businesses in the Village of Radium Hot Springs do not face undue competition, there may be value in allowing mobile vendors in certain niche situations, when certain conditions are met. We are asking the Council to consider permitting mobile vendors in situations where current service providers are not able to sufficiently meet demand, especially during the peak tourist season. This could be done on a case by case basis, with permits being awarded at the council's discretion.

The bylaw also may well not need to be done away with outright, but simply modified to some degree. In order to avoid over-congestion or traffic flow related complications, it may be worth while, for example, to only adjust the bylaw for situations where vendors could be located on private property. Approaching from this angle would also mean that prospective vendors would still be contributing to the village's tax base (either through ownership or via a rental agreement), and therefore would not be unfairly benefitting from a new prospective bylaw relative to other tax paying businesses.

We feel that during the height of the tourist season, an additional high quality 'coffee and a snack' style takeaway vendor could help to meet overflowing clientele from current establishments in a way that would not hurt their bottom line. We feel that visitors to Radium deserve to have their needs met in a timely and enjoyable fashion, and that if we succeed as a community in making that happen, it will be good for us all in the long run.

We hope that you find our rationale for requesting an adjustment to the above bylaw to be sound, and are only asking that applications be considered on a case by case basis, rather than denied outright. At the very least we feel that the bylaw deserves reconsideration and re-evaluation as the needs of communities do change over time.

Steamboat Collective Corp.

Steamboat Collective Corp has applied for a Development Permit to construct a mixed use commercial building on a vacant lot located at the intersection of Main Street West and Radium Blvd. Civic address 7597 Main Street West.

The proposed mixed use, one storey building will house a lounge, book/gift shop and a café. Both the lounge and the café will have additional exterior seating. The exterior finish of the building is stone and timber framing. The building main floor area 2861 sq ft, of which the lounge is 1478 sq ft, the gift shop is 609 sq ft and the café is 774 sq ft.

A total of 11 parking are required with 8 spaces, (2 of which may have electrical vehicle charging) onsite; 1 space on Main Street West; and 2 spaces on Radium Blvd.

No variances to the Zoning Bylaw have been requested nor are required.

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 165, 2022

1. Pursuant to Section 490 of the *Local Government Act*, the Council of the Village of Radium Hot Springs has, by resolution, issued a Development Permit to:

This Development Permit is issued subject to compliance with all of the bylaws of the Village of Radium Hot Springs applicable thereto, except as specifically varied or supplemented by this Permit and it applies only to those lands within the Village of Radium Hot Springs and currently legally described as:

Parcel A, (Reference Plan 112319I), District Lot 2580, Kootenay District, PID 016-407-954



- 2. This Development Permit is issued specifically to permit construction of a one storey mixed use commercial building, housing a café, gift shop and lounge. The layout of all features within the site including building location, bear proof garbage containment, screening, parking, landscaping and access routes shall be as per 'Proposed Plot Plan Site 1 of 1 drawn by Cornerstone Drafting, dated February 17, 2022 attached to and forming part of this permit.
- 3. The general form and character of the building shall be in accordance with the architectural drawings "Massing Study", (3 sheets); drawn by Frank Architecture and Interiors, dated December 17, 2021 attached to and forming part of this permit. Finishing materials will be: Stone and Timber Framing as shown on the Massing Study drawings. Proposed floor plan shall be as per Cornerstone Drafting sheets 1 & 2 dated February 17, 2022 attached to and forming part of this permit.
- 4. On site parking shall be as per Proposed Plot Plan drawing Site 1, with 8 parking stalls and one loading stall. A total of 11 parking spaces are required. This includes 8 parking spaces on site, 1 parking space adjacent to the property on Main Street West, and 2 spaces on Radium Blvd adjacent to the property. All parking shall be provided with adequate curbs in order to retain all vehicles within permitted parking areas. The parking area shall be surfaced with asphalt, concrete or similar pavement so as to provide a surface that is durable and dust-free and shall be so graded and drained as to properly dispose of all surface water.
- 5. Off site servicing shall consist of pavement, curb, gutter and sidewalk along Radium Blvd. to accommodate additional required parking. This construction shall occur to the standards detailed in the Village of Radium Hot Springs "Subdivision and Development Servicing Bylaw No. 169, 1997"
- 6. Drainage engineering on site shall be according to the standards of the municipality and shall be subject to an independent engineering review, at the proponent's cost. All storm water drainage shall be contained onsite, as per Village requirements.


- 7. Maintenance of lanes for access is the responsibility of the Permittee.
- 8. The said lands shall be developed generally in accordance with the terms and conditions and provisions of this Permit and any plans and specifications attached to this Permit shall form a part hereof. In the event of a conflict, the provisions of this Permit prevail over any provisions of Zoning Bylaw No. 338, 2007.
- 9. If the Permittee does not commence the development permitted by this Permit within 24 months of the date of this Permit, the permit shall lapse.
- 10. This Permit is not a building permit. Construction may not commence until a building permit has been approved.
- 11. Pursuant to section 503(1) of the Local Government Act, the Village of Radium Hot Springs agrees to file a notice of permit in the Land Title Office that the said lands are subject to this Permit.
