- b) Request for reconsideration of Bylaw 244 was tabled and Council directed staff to contact Tourism Radium and the Radium Chamber and obtain more information and perspective from business owners.
- c) Council directed staff to investigate opportunities to apply to the CleanBC Communities Fund. CFO Sharp presented an idea of generating energy from the Village's water line intake and installing solar panels at the water treatment plant.
- d) Councillor Gray asked about emergency planning. CAO Dohlen advised he was the coordinator for Radium, and that EMBC has changed to a regional focus, with Cranbrook being the regional operational center for the valley. CAO Dohlen also advised that staff have taken inventory of sandbags for possible flooding events. Mayor Reinhardt advised that the Red Cross is always looking for volunteers and that those interested could contact the RDEK.

CFO Karen Sharp advised the Save our Sheep donations are nearing \$43,000. CV Reporter Steve Hubrecht asked for contact info regarding the snowpack results.

Being a bylaw to amend the Official Community Plan Bylaw.


WHEREAS Section 471, and 472 of the *Local Government Act* provide that municipalities may adopt Official Community Plans so as to guide decisions on planning and land use management, and;

WHEREAS Section 460 provides that these guidelines may be amended;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Village of Radium Hot Springs in open meeting assembled *enacts* as follows:

- 1. That the Planned Land Use Map 'Schedule A' of the Village of Radium Hot Springs Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 396, 2013 be amended by changing the land use designation on the property shown outlined in heavy black on Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this bylaw from:
 - a. Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, Block 3, Plan 2606. DL 2580, Kootenay District: from "Highway Commercial to Mixed Commercial Residential".
 - b. Civic address: 4883 Stanley Street
- 2. This Bylaw may be cited as "Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No. 471, 2022"

Schedule A – Bylaw 471, 2022

BYLAW 472, 2022.

Being a bylaw to amend the zoning bylaw.

WHEREAS Section 479 of the *Local Government Act* provides that a local government may, by bylaw, divide the whole or part of the municipality into zones; regulate the use of land, building and structures within a zone; regulate the siting, size and dimensions of buildings; regulate the location of uses on the land and within buildings and structures; and that the regulations may be different for different uses within a zone;

AND WHEREAS the Council deems it desirable to amend the zoning bylaw, cited as "Village of Radium Hot Springs Zoning Bylaw No. 338, 2007" to change the following listed lands from **C1** – **Highway Commercial to C2 Pedestrian Commercial/Residential**

Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, Block 3, Plan 2606, DL 2580, Kootenay District

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Village of Radium Hot Springs in open meeting assembled *enacts* that the Village of Radium Hot Springs Zoning Bylaw No. 338, 2007 is hereby amended as follows:

That Schedule "B", Official Zoning Map referenced to in section 5.2 of the Village of Radium Hot Springs Zoning Bylaw No. 338, 2007 is hereby amended with the zoning area changes shown on Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this bylaw.





BYLAW NO. 473, 2022.

Being a bylaw to regulate traffic speed limits within the Village of Radium Hot Springs.

WHEREAS pursuant to the relevant sections of the Motor Vehicle Act and the Community Charter, the Council is empowered to regulate traffic within the Village of Radium Hot Springs;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Village of Radium Hot Springs, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

- (1) On any street within the Village of Radium Hot Springs:
 - (a) no person shall drive a vehicle at a greater rate of speed than forty (40) kilometers per hour, unless otherwise posted, and;
 - (b) where speed limits are posted at playgrounds and parks, the posted rate of speed shall be thirty (30) kilometers per hour.
- (2) This bylaw shall not apply to speed limit controls on the Provincial Highways.
- (3) On any alley or lane within the Village of Radium Hot Springs no person shall drive any vehicle at a rate of speed in excess of twenty (20) kilometers per hour.
- (4) The Public Works Superintendent, at his discretion or upon resolution of Council, is hereby authorized to locate, establish and maintain upon any streets such signs, traffic control devices or barriers as may be deemed necessary for the regulation, direction and control of traffic.
- (5) This Bylaw may be enforced by any member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and penalties will be those as prescribed by Provincial legislation and regulation.
- (6) This bylaw may be referred to as the 'Speed Limit Bylaw No. 473, 2022'.
- (7) This Bylaw will come into full force and effect upon the date of passage.
