SUMMARY INFORMATION

This is a recommended grant application to the BC Active Transportation Infrastructure Grants Program to build phase 1 of the Village of Radium Hot Springs North-South Active Transportation Corridor as identified in the plan. This corridor will improve connectivity across the Village.

This is the main priority project as identified in the plan and will contribute to an even more walkable and bikeable community.

The end result would be a combination of Active Transportation route types from shared neighbourhood Bikeway on Edelweiss St., Pioneer Ave., and Canyon Ave. (signage and road

markings), 3 metre paved multi-use pathways on Park Drive West and on Village greenspace, and crosswalks on Stanley and St. Joseph Streets.

Part of these works – the Multi-use pathway on Park Dr. W are included and funded in other plans – for example the Resort Development Strategy 2022-24 -- and these funds can be used (levered) to cover the Village's portion of the BC AT Infrastructure Grant.

This BC AT Infrastructure Program application is for \$217,778. The remaining \$134,343, as mentioned above, is included in the Village's Resort Development Strategy Document and can be used to cover the Village's contribution to the BC Active Transportation Grant. Total phase 1 project cost is estimated at \$352,121 by Ian Roth, P. Eng.

This grant represents a good opportunity to build a key portion of the recently adopted Active Transportation Network Plan and begin to see that plan come to life.

The grant deadline was October 21, 2022. The grant application has been made and submitted. It is pending a Council resolution of support.

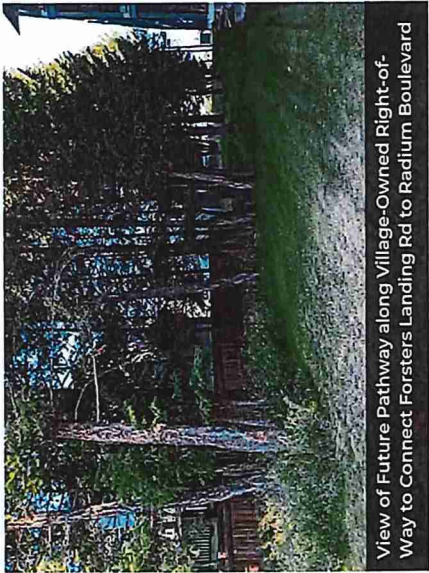

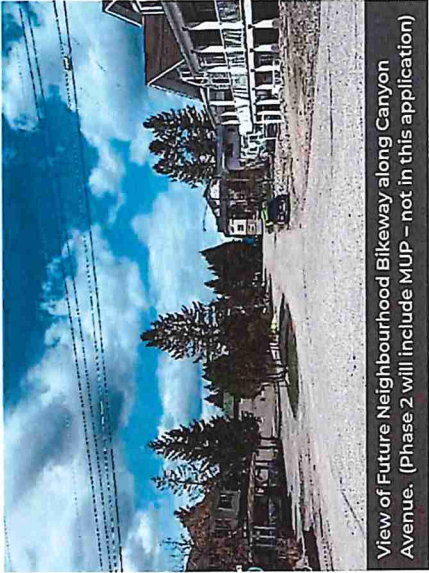

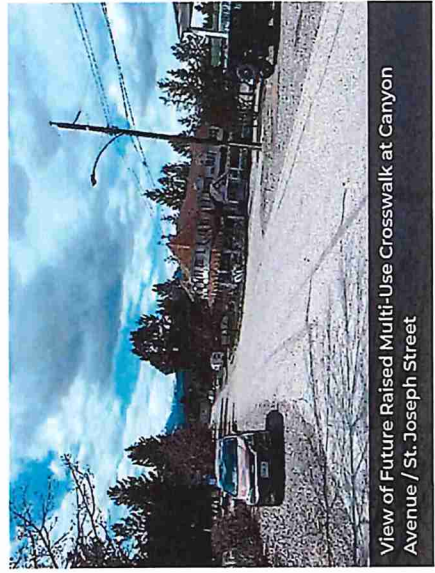
View of Future Pathway along Village-Owned Right-of-Way to Connect Forsters Landing Rd to Radium Boulevard



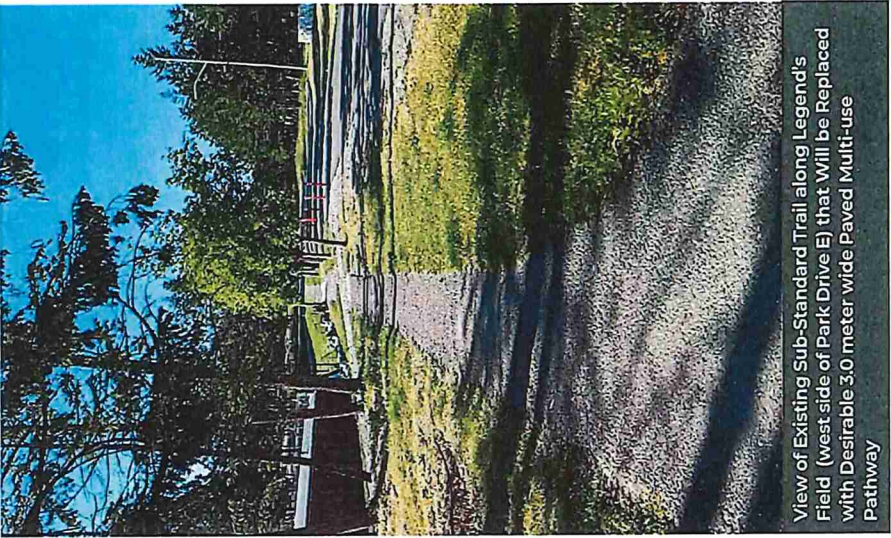
View of Future Neighbourhood Bikeway along Canyon Avenue. (Phase 2 will include MUP – not in this application)



View of Future Raised Multi-Use Crosswalk and Sidewalk Widening at Park Drive E / St. Joseph St Crossing

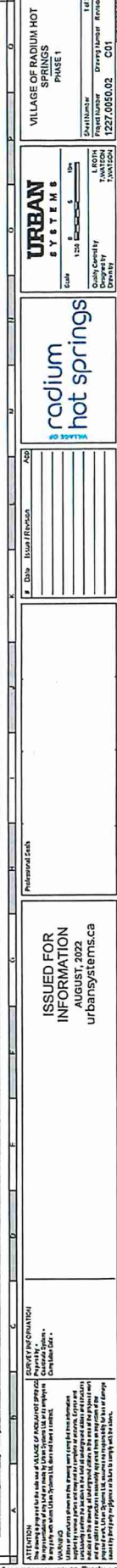


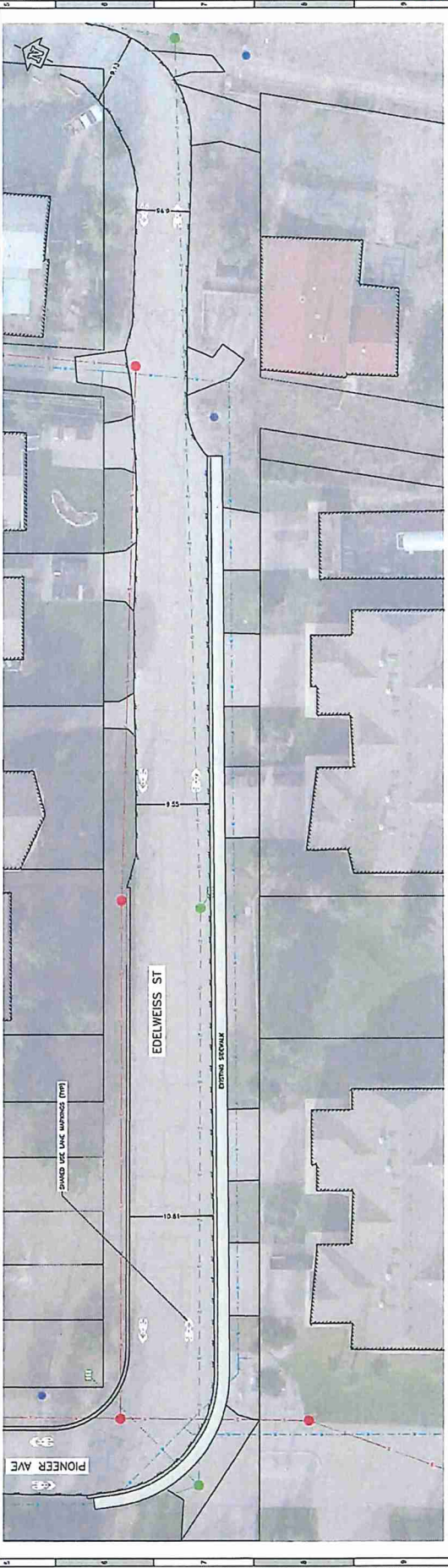
View of Future Raised Multi-Use Crosswalk at Canyon Avenue / St. Joseph Street


